Priyanka Pillai, Bioinformatician and Data Steward, Melbourne Data Analytics Platform, University of Melbourne, spoke about "The Role of Data in a Rapid and Coordinated Response to Infectious Disease Outbreaks".

She documented the many ways the quality and availability of data for the infectious diseases community can be vital to challenges to public health such as COVID-19, demonstrating how the COVID-19 genome data is being shared, analysed and reproduced in an efficient and transparent way.
